


Creating a Password

The purpose of this article is to help you successfully create your password when completing the registration form on MedCompli.com.

You may be reading this because you received a message stating that your *password does not meet requirements* after attempting, or perhaps you are looking for the parameters before doing so. Either way, let's start with the minimum parameters you will need:

- **10 characters long**
- **One+ uppercase letter**
- **One+ lowercase letter**
- **One+ numerical character**
- **One+ symbol**

Let's review two examples, and identify which one is valid, and why:

- **J@sonGreen** This is NOT a valid password. Though it meets most of the requirements, it does not contain any numbers.
- **G!nk8biloBa** – This is a valid and strong password. It contains at least one uppercase (G, B), lowercase (n,k,b,l,l,o,a), numerical (8), symbol (!) and contains 11 characters, which meets the minimum 10 character requirement.

As we can see with the examples above, having most of the parameters, but not all, will cause a password creation to fail. It is important that we check off each requirement as we create a password.

Tips for simplicity:

- Create a password using elements that are memorable to you. For example, if mangoes are your favorite fruit and your favorite color is green, a possible password could be **gr33nM@ngo**. Using familiar words while altering the characters to meet the password requirement makes it simple to remember, yet complex enough to make it safe.
- Store the created password with a password manager of your choice (Google, LastPass, etc..) to make your login process easier (this is completely optional, but can be helpful)

Once created, retype the same password to confirm.
